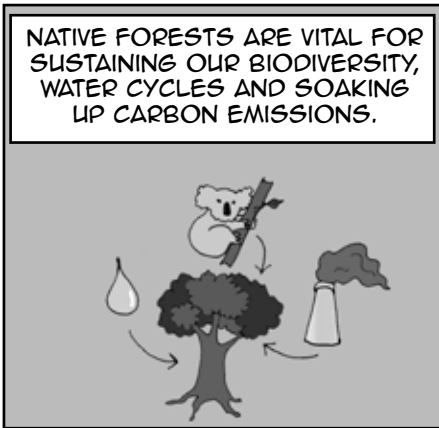

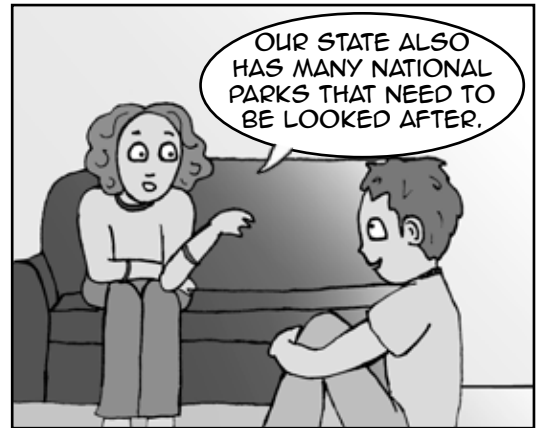

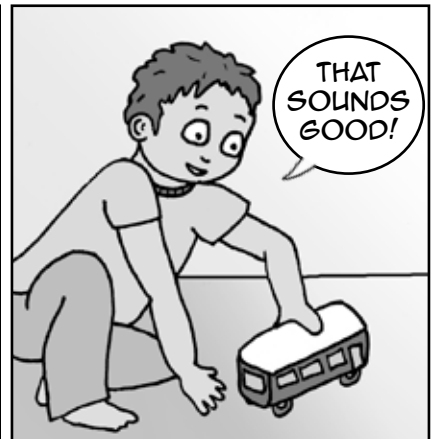




**Did you know?**  
 Gunns Limited, one of Tasmania's largest forestry companies, recently decided to stop logging native forests. In NSW, however, the government is considering a deal with Nippon Paper Group to build a biomass plant fuelled by "waste" from native forests.



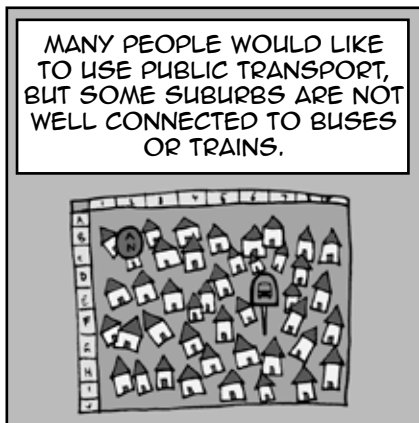
**Did you know?**  
 A campaign is underway to protest the proposed development of an old air services site in Cranebrook into residential land. The Nature Conservation Council of NSW (NCC) believe that this site has great conservation value and should be placed under the management of the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service.

In recent years, reforms have been made to planning laws in NSW which have made it easier for large developments to be pushed through without sufficient environmental assessments or community consultations.

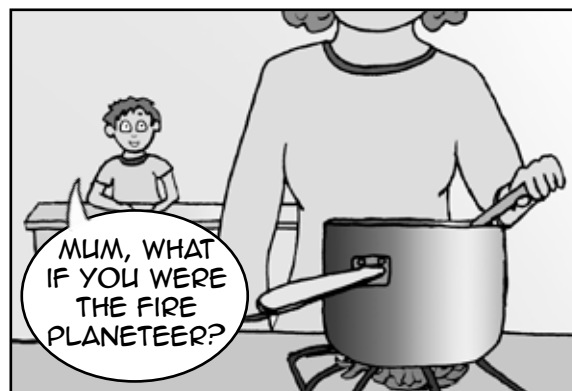


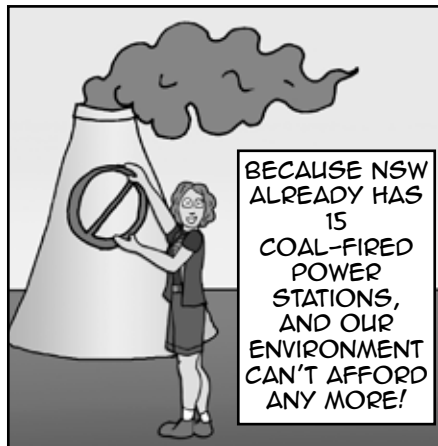
**Did you know?**

The north-western suburbs of Sydney have been waiting decades for a rail link to connect them to metropolitan Sydney. Successive NSW governments have promised to deliver this link. As yet none have delivered.

**Did you know?**  
The NSW government recently approved an upgrade to Munmorah Power Station in eastern NSW. Despite acknowledging that NSW needs to drastically reduce its carbon dioxide emissions, the government has extended the life of this coal-fired power plant into the future.

**Did you know?**  
Only about 6% of electricity used in NSW comes from renewable sources.  
The solar bonus scheme implemented by the NSW government has been a huge success. Some argue it has been too successful, blowing out electricity costs for those without solar panels. Parliament is currently debating slashing the feed-in tariff for solar users.
